- Solicit and schedule speaking engagements for schools, youth groups, camps, associations, clubs and institutions.
- Schedule, arrange and organize Speaker's Bureau Volunteers
- Organize and facilitate Speaker's Bureau Training
- Solicit volunteers for Speaker's Bureau
- Keep up-to-date on key life issues and ensure that presentations up-to-date
- Assist in the development of educational resources as required
- Ensure that educational materials are readily available for presentations
- Maintain an up-to-date and accurate log documenting the number of presentations and participants
- Assist in the development of Pro-life Clubs and provide ongoing support as necessary
- Assist in the development, implementation and launching of Lifefacts.ca Website
- Support the Executive Director in the planning and facilitation of TCDSB Respect for Life conference and activities
- Coordinate and run Annual Street Campaign
- Manage display booth as required at external events
- Attend at least one major conference per year recommended by the Association
- Other duties as directed by the Executive Director.
